The Commission on Human Rights

- 1 Recognizing the importance of integration of asylum seekers into host countries in order to prevent the destabilizing effect of a non-producing refugee population,
- 3 Recalling that an asylum seeker is a refugee desiring residency in the host country,
- 4 Noting with deep concern that not all member states can afford such integration programs,
- 5 Further Recognizing that the said programs need to be expanded to include job training and cultural education,
- 7 1. *Endorses* the formation of a CHR-Integration fund for Asylum-seekers, which shall provide need-based aid to member states on a case by case, application basis;
- 9 2. *Proclaims* that the said funds shall be used towards educating asylum-seeking refugees in the traditions, culture, history, and language of the host country;
- 11 3. *Recognizes* that the asylum-seekers should be encouraged to simultaneously preserve their cultural roots;
- 4. *Calls upon* this fund to also provide the public with information regarding the intent and outcomes of each program to the citizens of the host country in an effort to eliminate racial discrimination and xenophobia;
- 16 5. Requests that the fund will make available the job training of asylum seekers by
 17 multinational corporations (MNCs) and, if applicable, local public and private companies
 18 who are in need of additional employees.
