- 1 Recalling The Human Waste report commemorating the United Nations World Water Day on March 22, 2002,
- 3 Believing that all people of the world have the basic right to clean water,
- 4 Deeply concerned that citizens of many developing countries are trying to subsist on less than
- 5 twenty percent of the UN daily minimum standard (50 liters per day) of clean water,
- 6 *Convinced* that sanitization of water is essential to improving living standards in developing countries, especially in the areas of agricultural development and disease prevention,
- 8 *Noting* that the economies of most developing countries rely on their agricultural sector for which clean water is vital,
- Recognizing that many people living in undeveloped areas lack education in proper health practices regarding water treatment,
  - 1. *Calls upon* the World Health Organization (WHO) and member states to collaborate with NGOs, IGOs, and charities such as WaterAid and The Water Supply and Sanitation Collaborative Council to concentrate their efforts towards improving water sanitization, and thus living conditions, throughout the world;
- 2. *Strongly recommends* that the global community works towards attaining the UN minimum daily standard of available, clean water (50 liters per person, per day);
- 18 3. Supports educational programs lead by NGOs, IGOs, and charities that instruct local residents and farmers of undeveloped areas on safe water practices and ways to properly sanitize the water available;
- 21 4. *Encourages* the use of cooperative efforts, such as the program created by NEPAD for
