### ■ After the degree

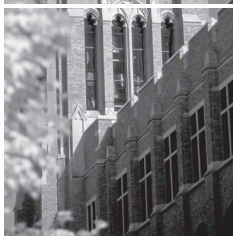
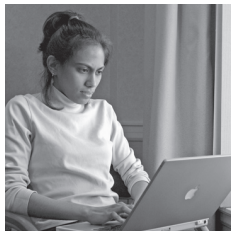

## Keynote Speaker: Gillian Sorensen

Gillian Sorensen, now Senior Advisor/National Advocate at the United Nations Foundation, has had a long career working with and for the UN. From 1997-2003, she served as Assistant Secretary-General for External Relations on appointment by Secretary-General Kofi Annan. She was responsible for outreach to civil society, including NGOs committed to peace, justice, development and human rights. From 1993-1996, she served as Special Adviser for Public Policy on appointment by Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali, where she led the global commemoration of the UN's Fiftieth Anniversary and the coordination of the UN50 Summit at Headquarters in New York with 180 Heads of Government participating.

From 1978-1990, she was the New York City Commissioner for the United Nations, head of the City's liaison with the world's largest diplomatic community, on appointment by Mayor Edward Koch. Her responsibilities related to

diplomatic security and immunity, housing and education, and other cultural and business contacts between the host city and over 30,000 diplomats. She was referred to by The New York Times as "The Diplomat's Diplomat" for her work at this time.

Mrs. Sorensen is a graduate of Smith College and studied at the Sorbonne. She has been a Fellow at the Kennedy School of Government (Institute of Politics) at Harvard University. She is a frequent speaker on United Nations issues and the US-UN relationship.

She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Women's Foreign Policy Group. In addition to her public service, she has been a delegate to three national Presidential conventions.

The United Nations Foundation was launched in 1998 by Ted Turner's historic billion dollar gift to help further the goals of the United Nations. The Foundation is an independent, public charity that seeks to inform and educate Americans

about the United Nations and US-UN issues, with a focus on the environment, children's health and human rights in the developing world.

## AMUN delegation lottery

A lottery for country assignments for the 2007 AMUN Conference will be held on Monday, 20 November 2006 in the Michigan Room



Lottery applications are due before 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, 19 November 2006. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2007 fees. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for first choice of country assignments. Schools that register for more than one delegation will be placed in the initial lottery for one delegation, and will be assigned additional delegations following the initial lottery.

### Fee discount for all Lottery participants!

Any school that registers through the lottery will receive a \$5.00 PER DELEGATE DISCOUNT on all delegate fees for the 2007 AMUN Conference. Thus if you bring 4 students or 40, AMUN will take \$5.00 off the regular per-delegate fees for each delegate attending. ## Reverence for Life ♪Music for Life♪

*Youth in Concert for Global Healing*

**Sunday, April 22, 2007 – Earth Day 2007**

April 2007 marks the 50th anniversary of the first use of global telecommunications for peace: Dr. Albert Schweitzer's 1957 "Declaration of Conscience", written in Africa and broadcast globally via Radio Oslo, under the auspices of the Nobel Committee. In his Declaration of Conscience, Dr. Schweitzer called for people worldwide to speak out against the atmospheric nuclear test explosions that were then poisoning the world. As a result, a permanent ban on atmospheric nuclear testing was achieved. *To achieve similar victories over today's threats to survival and health, our world needs similar outpourings of public support for change.*

Dr. Schweitzer believed that most of the world's problems – from the holocaust threatened by the existence of nuclear arsenals to the terrible unmet health needs he faced daily in Africa – were all symptoms of a deeper underlying failure to adequately foster an ethic of *Reverence for all Life*. Rachel Carson, pioneer of the global environmental movement that now celebrates April 22 as Earth Day each year, dedicated *Silent Spring* to Dr. Schweitzer.

Dr. Schweitzer also believed that the idealism of youth holds the key to the world's future. In this spirit, on Sunday, April 22, 2007 at 4pm youth orchestras and other musical groups around the world will be invited to create a global wave of music, beginning with concerts in the Marshall Islands (site of 1950's nuclear test explosions), Hiroshima, and Nagasaki, and passing westward with the sun across time zones through Asia, South Asia, the Middle East, Europe/Africa, and North and South America, culminating in San Francisco, where the U.N. was founded. Anyone in the world can participate simply by signing up at [www.reverenceforlife.org/music](http://www.reverenceforlife.org/music) and playing music on behalf of Reverence for all Life. These concerts will be an expression by the world's youth, through the universal language of music, of the shared yearning of people for a safer and healthier world.

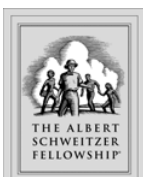
Accompanying the music, individuals and organizations throughout the world will be encouraged to engage in additional Earth Day activities, such as planting and distributing sunflowers, the global symbol of efforts to abolish nuclear weapons. Religious organizations throughout the world will be encouraged to incorporate Reverence for Life themes in their weekend worship services, youth education programs, or other activities.

### **Monday, April 23, 2007: Declarations of Conscience** *Abolish Weapons of Mass Destruction; Mobilize Tools of Global Healing*

On Monday, April 23, 2007, the exact 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Dr. Schweitzer's 1957 Declaration of Conscience, people throughout the world, including all Nobel peace laureates, will be invited to issue their own individual or collective "2007 Declaration(s) of Conscience." Participants will be asked to transcend political, cultural, religious, or national differences and identify concrete action steps, both local and global, through which they can together address important problems of peace and justice, health, and the environment. At a local level, identified problems and proposed solutions may vary as widely as the diversity of human communities. At a global level, participants will be encouraged to include in their Declarations of Conscience an appeal to national and world leaders to work together with greatly increased vigor to achieve the U.N. Millennium Goals, adopted unanimously in September 2000 by the U.N. General Assembly at a meeting that included the largest number of heads of state ever gathered together. Special emphasis will be placed on the urgency of efforts to *Abolish Weapons of Mass Destruction and Mobilize Tools of Global Healing*, including the abolition of nuclear weapons, protection of the global environment, and steps to address the health and poverty crisis in Schweitzer's beloved Africa.

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

### **What is “Reverence for Life”?**

“Reverence for Life” is the English translation of Schweitzer’s German phrase *Ehrfurcht vor dem Leben*, which Schweitzer believed was the universal basis of all true ethics. The word “reverence” in English does not fully capture the sense of profound, overwhelming awe of the German word *Ehrfurcht*. The capacity for “Reverence for Life” that Schweitzer believed we all carry within us involves the kind of experience that a mother or father -- or in fact any healthy human being -- has in watching a newborn baby emerge from the womb and emit its first cry. It includes not just awe at the miracle of life, but an almost physical yearning to do anything we can to help protect this life and foster its development. While this sense of *awe and responsibility* comes easily to us in response to those to whom we are naturally attracted, Schweitzer believed that through our intellect and moral conscience we are compelled to recognize that all of the life we find around us has value.

### **What kind of music should be played? Classical? Modern?**

Any music that an individual or group wants to contribute to the global wave of music is welcomed. We hope that all of the world’s diverse musical traditions will be represented and expressed.

### **What if I/we can’t organize a musical event at the exact date and time of April 22, 4pm?**

Any musical events earlier in April 2007 that are dedicated to *Reverence for Life* will be part of an “Overture” or “Prelude” period; any that are later in April 2007 will be part of a “Postlude.”

### **Is this just for youth orchestras (or other youth performing music)?**

No. Anyone of any age is encouraged to participate. The music can be by youth, for youth, or both.

### **What ages qualify as “youth”?**

Dr. Schweitzer believed that youthfulness was a matter of spirit, not age. There is no age cutoff.

### **Is this initiative primarily about big global issues?**

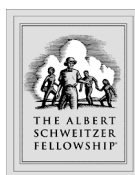
No. Reverence for Life begins at home. In a spirit of “Think Globally, Act Locally”, we encourage people to use local musical events on April 22 to draw attention to any local needs they are concerned about.

### **What specific policies about nuclear weapons, the environment, or global poverty and health does this initiative favor?**

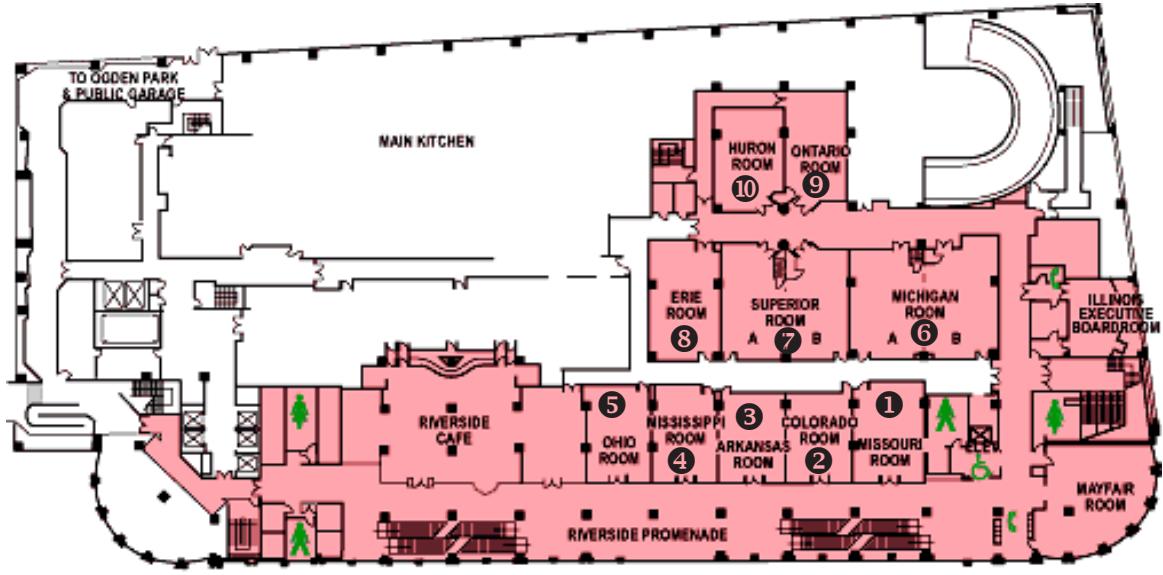
No specific policies. Participants need only support the twin overarching goals of *abolishing weapons of mass destruction* and *mobilizing tools of global healing*. The individuals and organizations that co-founded this initiative have set aside political, national, religious and other differences to work together to achieve these urgent goals. We welcome creativity from everyone who becomes involved – not just in the April 22 musical events, but also in working to abolish nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction, to protect the environment, and to eradicate severe poverty and related disease in places like Dr. Schweitzer’s beloved Africa. Dr. Schweitzer insisted that “the most important thing in education is to make young people think for themselves.” We believe that if young people unite, fueled by their shared reverence for all life, solutions will rapidly follow.

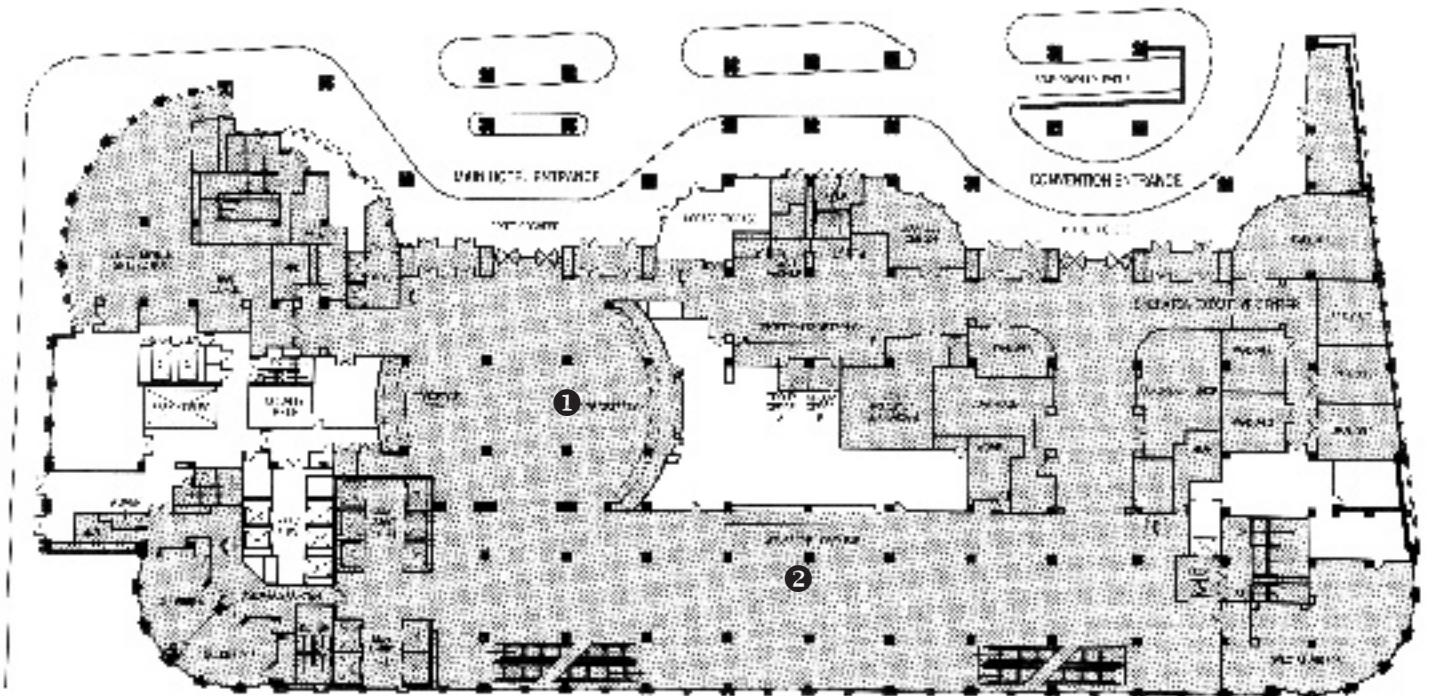


**LEVEL 2: MEETING ROOMS**

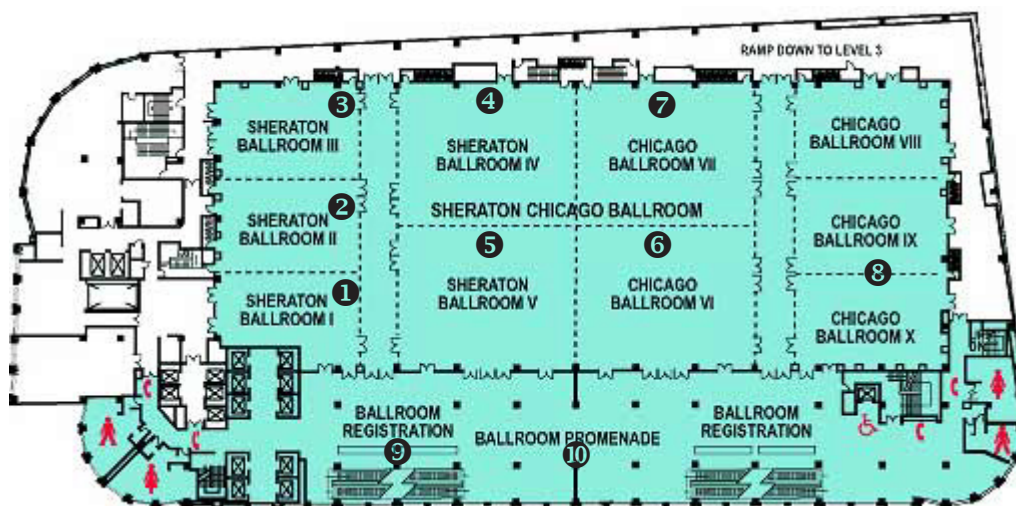
**LEVEL 3: HOTEL LOBBY & LOUNGE AREA**
