SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in the Middle East

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council

The Historical Security Council,

- 1 *Disturbed* by the continuing violence seen in the Palestinian- Israeli conflict,
2
3 *Recognizing* the necessity of peace in this conflict as crucial to the security of the
4 region,
5
6 *Recalling* the fourth Geneva Convention, particularly Articles Three and Four of
7 Part One concerning the status of civilians in occupied territories,
8
9 *Emphasizing* Security Council Resolutions 641(1989), 646(1989), and 647
10 (1989),
11
12 *Reaffirming* that the United Nations recognizes the PLO as a legitimate political
13 representative of the Palestinian people as evidenced by the address of the PLO Chairman
14 in 1974 to the General Assembly,
15
16 *Concerned* that the present stance of the involved parties hinders peace between
17 the conflicting parties,
18
19 *Strongly* reaffirming the principles of General Assembly Resolution 44/21 (1989),
20
21 1. *Requests* the Secretary-General to dispatch a special envoy to the occupied
22 territories to investigate the current violence via dialog's with both parties;

24 2. *Further asks* that the special envoy report back to the Security Council on the
25 regular interval of two months;

27 3. *Empowers* this envoy to act as a mediating entity while engaging the concerned
28 parties in dialog;

30 4. *Urges* the commencing of a multilateral peace conference under the auspices of
31 the United Nations to be held in Paris, within the year, to bring Palestinian and Israeli
32 delegations selected from their respective missions to the United Nations, as well as a
33 delegation of five members of the Organization of Islamic Conference selected from
34 within the organization and representatives of the permanent members of the Security

35 Council, together to discuss relevant issues with the suggested topics of:

37 a. A joint declaration of acknowledgment regarding the importance of upholding
38 human rights in areas of conflict and the necessity of protecting civilians from violations;

40 b. The future status of disputed territories, including Jerusalem, acquired during
41 the 1967 War;

43 c. The status refugees in the areas of concern;

45 d. A mutual acceptance of both parties right to exist;

47 5. *Calls upon* all involved parties to renounce the use of violence and violent acts
48 as an extension of political will;

50 6. *Urges* an easing of tensions and efforts to curb the violent activities in order to
51 form a constructive environment in which dialog can take place towards finding a lasting
52 peaceful solution to the situation.
