5 6 7 8	<i>Recalling</i> the progress made at the 1994 Beijing World Conference on Women and noting the need for further implementation of those goals,
9 10 11	<i>Recalling</i> Chapters IV and VII of A/CONF. 171/13, the Report of the International Conference of Population and Development,
12 13 14	<i>Having examined</i> the international status of women's reproductive rights and reproductive health,
15 16 17	<i>Recognizing</i> the need to combat, by all means in accordance with the United Nations Charter and concurrent Resolutions, HIV/AIDS, infant mortality, crude birth, and the lack of reproductive healthcare and obstetric services,
18 19 20 21	<i>Guided by</i> the principles set forth at the 61st session of the Commission on Human rights,
22 23 24 25 26 27	<ol> <li>Urges all Member States to enforce existing resolutions and agreements to the best of their abilities, including those designed to:         <ul> <li>(a) Improve women's reproductive health by:</li> <li>(i) working to provide more reproductive healthcare and obstetric services, especially in rural areas where lack of infrastructure hinders the provision of such services;</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
28 29 30 31	<ul> <li>(ii) providing education on human rights, HIV/AIDS, family planning, and women's rights issues as each member nation sees fit;</li> <li>(iii) providing education for youth, men, and women on the reproductive system and processes;</li> </ul>

33	venereal disease, with specific focus on the HIV/AIDS, such as

35	(v) providing education on prevention and early detection of many sexually

37	(b) Encourage states to take legal action against all violence against
38	women and discourage discrimination on the basis of sex, bearing in
39	mind cultural differences;

41	2. Encourages all Member States to refrain from providing support to States
42	violating basic humanitarian rights towards women if that support assists or encourages
43	such violations, and to help those willing Member States to improve the status and
43 44	treatment of women thereby empowering women, providing the necessary assistance for
45	improvements in healthcare and education on said issues;

47	3. <i>Requests</i> that all States take the necessary steps, in compliance with relevant
48	resolutions to improve the status and health of women in order to reduce the rates of
49 50	infant mortality, venereal disease, and all forms of violence against women;

51	4. <i>Reminds</i> all states of their responsibility under the United Nations Charter to
52	comply with all relevant United Nations resolutions;

54	5. <i>Suggests</i> a provision of affordable anti-retroviral drugs to developing countries
55	without adequate funds dedicated to alleviating the problem of transmission of
56	HIV/AIDS, especially in cases of mother-to-child transmission.
