8	Recalling the Seventh Millennium Development Goal which focuses upon
9	environmental sustainability and its importance to the eradication of poverty as well as
10	capacity building for developing nations,

12	Noting with approval the Member States that have signed and ratified the Kyoto
13	Protocol,

14	<i>Alarmed</i> by the mounting repercussions of climate change,

24	economic crisis that is affecting all nation-states,

26	<i>Recognizing</i> the local and global responsibility each country has, as a member of
27	the global community, to pursue environmental sustainability,

29	<i>Recognizing</i> the need for capacity building to assist nations, especially developing
30 31	nations, to respond to climate change,
32	Taking into consideration the vulnerability of some nations to the adverse effects
33	of climate change and the difficulties faced in meeting the costs of adaptations to these
33 34	effects,

35 36	Acknowledging that because every nation is a stakeholder in the issue of global
37	climate change that it is in the best interest of developed nations to support the efforts of
38 39	developing nations to mitigate the impacts of climate change,
40	<i>Recognizing</i> the necessity for adaptation to the evident, yet varying impact of
41 42	climate change,
43	1. Congratulates the innovations of dedicated Member States to their own
44	environmental development that can potentially contribute to and set an example for other
45	states pursuing environmental initiatives;
46	
47	2. Invites other nations to join the governments of Austria, Belgium, Canada,
48	Ireland, Norway, New Zealand in providing financial resources to support the endeavors
49	of lesser developed nations;
50	
51	3. Urges bilateral and multilateral partnerships between developed and developing
52	nations in order to facilitate the exchange of specific alternative energy technologies and
53	education;
54	
55	4. Suggests these partnerships be regional and impact-specific to share adaptation
56 57	strategies to address various environmental issues that include but are not limited to: (a) Climate change;
58	(b) Desertification;
59	(c) Deforestation;
60	(d) Rising sea levels;
61	(e) Low lying areas;

63	5. Encourages countries to identify their specific environmental challenges and
64	develop local solutions that reflect internal capacity and domestic resources in a culturally
65	sensitive manner;

67	6. Urges countries to develop and elaborate appropriate and integrative plans for
68	coastal zone management, water resources and agriculture, and for the protection and
69	rehabilitation of areas, particularly those affected by drought and desertification, as well
70	as floods;
71	
72	7. <i>Calls</i> on governments to promote the development and implementation of
73	educational and public awareness programs, promote public access to information and

public participation, and promote training of scientific, technical, and managerial
personnel;
8. *Promotes* the establishment and utilization of green infrastructure;
9. *Recognizes* the unique opportunities for developed and developing countries to

 form partnerships with the goal of improving environmental sustainability and the
 development of their populations at large;
