1	<i>Recognizing</i> the ongoing efforts and progress made within each African nation
2	towards the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the significant amount of work
3	that still must be done to successfully achieve the MDG's targets by 2015,
4 5	Bearing in mind the effects of the global economic situation on growing African
6	economies,
7	economies,
8	<i>Fully aware</i> that updated, reliable data plays an integral role in the MDG process,
9	<i>T uny uware that aparted</i> , tendole data plays an integratione in the NIDO process,
10	Taking into consideration that there is a lack of awareness and engagement among
11	the general populace of local African communities, the key actor in making the
12	achievement of the MDGs a reality,
13	
14	Acknowledging that the half-way point to the 2015 target has passed and that there
15	is a dire need to approach the MDGs through strong, integrated stratagems,
16	
17	Observing the capability of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) to assist
18	African nations with developing effective and sustainable poverty reduction strategies,
19	
20	<i>Emphasizing</i> the need to develop more efficient information gathering and sharing
21	networks both within domestic states, and among the member states of Regional
22 23	Economic Communities' (RECs),
23 24	1. Encourages all member states to integrate a holistic road map towards
24 25	achieving the MDGs within their national development strategies, including Poverty
26	Reduction Strategy Papers, to ensure governmental participation and commitment to the
20	Goals;
28	
29	2. Reaffirms that embedding such a road map within national development policy

30	frameworks will fashion out a systematic, collective, and sustainable approach in
31	reaching the Goals by 2015;
32	
33	3. Recommends that all Member States make considerable efforts towards
34	formulating national road maps by:
35	(a) Identifying and addressing issues related to poverty reduction, such as
36	increasing opportunities for new investment, employment, and wealth by
37	creating a stable economic environment;
38	(b) Highlighting national development priorities which will concurrently foster
39	progress that relate to the Goals, such as:
40	(i) A focus on modernizing agriculture;
41	(ii) Support of the private sector within each country to facilitate
42	innovation and access to capital;
43	(iii) Enhancing human development and improving access to basic
44	services;
45	
46	4. Notes that newly created and currently existing national statistical systems for
47	tracking progress of the MDGs must be adequately supported, financially and through
48	research institutions and development partnerships, in order to:
49	(a) Carry out statistical research and reliable, consistent data in a timely
50	manner;
51	(b) Help form national policies towards attaining the Goals;
52	(c) Improve and expand the statistical capacity of these statistical systems;
53	
54	5. <i>Endorses</i> that effective monitoring and evaluation of a nation's progress
55	through these statistical systems will lead to the development of new strategies and efforts
56	towards achieving the MDGs;
57	
58	6. <i>Emphasizes</i> that it is imperative that every party involved with data collection
59	participate in national processes by effectively monitoring and reviewing progress
60	towards the Goals actively;
61	
62	7. <i>Supports</i> efforts to enhance awareness of the MDGs on the local and
63	governmental level for the purpose of continuous involvement and enforcement of the
64	Goals;

66	8. <i>Strongly endorses</i> the use of RECs to develop a broader information gathering
67 68	and sharing framework among ECA Member States, so as to better align development
68	initiatives between different nations.
