AMUN Keynote Speaker — John W. McArthur Chief Executive Officer & Executive Director Millennium Promise



John W. McArthur is the Chief Executive Officer of Millennium Promise, the leading international non-profit organization solely committed to supporting the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals to halve extreme poverty by 2015. In this capacity he oversees the Millennium Villages project, which supports integrated social and business development services for more than 400,000 people in rural communities across 10 countries in Africa. Dr. McArthur is also a Research Associate at the Earth Institute at Columbia University, where he previously served as Policy Director, and teaches at Columbia's School of International and Public Affairs.

In 2007 and 2008 he co-chaired the International Commission on Education for Sustainable Development Practice, an initiative sponsored by the MacArthur Foundation to identify the cross-disciplinary training requirements for the next generation of sustainable development practitioners. He now co-chairs the International Advisory Board of the ongoing effort to launch a new global network of Masters in Development Practice programs.

Previously, Dr. McArthur served as Deputy Director and Manager of the UN Millennium Project. In that role he coordinated a global network of nearly 300 experts who served on ten thematic Task Forces, oversaw a policy team that provided integrated technical advice to governments in low-income countries around the world, and served as lead editor of the Project's final report to the UN Secretary-General, Investing

in Development: A Practical Plan to Achieve the Millennium Development Goals.

Prior to that he was a Research Fellow at the Center for International Development at Harvard University, where he co-authored the Global Competitiveness Report with Michael Porter and Jeffrey Sachs. He completed a Masters and Doctorate in Economics at Oxford University, which he attended as a Rhodes Scholar; a Masters in Public Policy at Harvard University's John F Kennedy School of Government; and a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) at the University of British Columbia. He has been recognized by the World Economic Forum as a Young Global Leader.

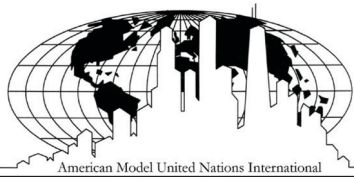

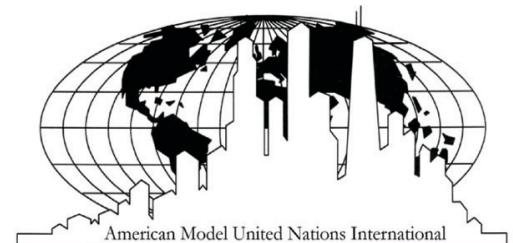

AMUN DELEGATION LOTTERY

A lottery for country assignments for the 2011 AMUN Conference will be held on Monday, 22 November 2010 in the Northwest Exhibit Hall 5 on the Lower Level.

Lottery applications are due to the Executive Office on the 3rd floor, Room PDR 1 before 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, 21 November 2010. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2011 fees. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for first choice of country assignments. Schools that register for more than one delegation will be placed in the initial lottery for one delegation, and will be assigned additional delegations in subsequent lottery rounds.



Fee discount for all lottery participants!

Any school that registers through the lottery will receive a \$5.00 PER DELEGATE DISCOUNT on all delegate fees for the 2011 AMUN Conference. Thus if you bring 5 students or 50, AMUN will take \$5.00 off the regular per-delegate fees for each delegate attending. Even if you add additional delegations at a later date, the \$5/delegate discount will still apply.

Please note, the dates for next year's AMUN Conference are 19-22 November 2011. Applications for the 2011 AMUN Lottery and 2011 Available Country List are available at the Conference Services Desk.

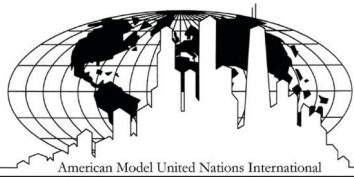
SAFETY AT AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, but encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel. We also suggest that you follow several common sense rules to keep all participants safe during the conference. These include the following:

- As a general rule, do not leave the hotel grounds without letting your group know how to find you;
- Always let one of the leaders of your group (faculty, club officer, etc.) know where you are going prior to leaving the area around the hotel (to visit local friends or relatives, etc.);
- Never leave the hotel alone after dark; always travel with at least one person that you know;
- Always remove your name tag prior to leaving the hotel so as not to advertise yourself as a “tourist;”
- Help other participants to be safe by encouraging others to not travel outside of the hotel alone;
- Inform one of the leaders of your group immediately if you have a safety concern, or if any emergency situation occurs to you or another participant, regardless of the time;
- Remember that safety should always be more important than avoiding minor embarrassment to you or another person.

Please feel free to contact the AMUN staff at any time during the Conference, day or night, if any emergency or similar event occurs where we can be of assistance. **We can be reached in Room J on the 4th Floor of the Chicago Hilton Hotel, or find any Secretariat member wearing a blue badge.** If an emergency occurs that requires immediate help, you should also feel free to contact hotel security (dial 0 and ask the operator for “security”) for assistance.
