Aware of the problems of gender inequality in several members states particularly in the context of home care-giving for victims of HIV/AIDS,	
Deeply concerned by this inequality has inhibited women and girls from pursuing higher education and employment opportunities,	
<i>Taking</i> into consideration the admirable efforts put forth by the Millennium Development Goals in reducing gender inequality,	
Noting with satisfaction the World Heath Organization for their considerable efforts in combating the HIV/AIDS pandemic among less Developed Countries,	
Further recognizing former International Human Rights Treaties, the Convention on the Rights of the Child, and the Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination of Women,	
1. <i>Encourages</i> Member State education in promoting the prevention	es to acknowledge the value of the gender sensitive on of the spread of HIV/AIDS;
2. <i>Calls</i> upon Member States education at earlier ages;	s to direct educational priorities to gender sensitive
3. <i>Further</i> calls upon Member States to increase educational opportunities in rural areas for girls who may be forced to leave school in the interest of care-giving;	
4. <i>Recommends</i> that Member States implement policy that promotes the employment and empowerment of women in the health care sector;	
5. <i>Urges</i> Member States to a	cknowledge the value of unpaid work such as child

care-giving by women and its effect on domestic economies;
