The Historical Security Council

- 1 *Stressing the importance of* Security Council resolutions 743 (1992) and 819
2 (1993) and other pertinent resolutions, as well as the need for the goals of these
3 resolutions to be met,
4
5 *Encouraging* communication with the North Atlantic Treaty Alliance on this very
6 sensitive issue,
7
8 *Deeply concerned by* the escalating violence in Bosnia,
9
10 *Deeply disturbed by* the continuing reports of human rights violations within the
11 State of Bosnia,
12
13 *Condemning* the severe atrocities against Muslim Bosnians, Croats and Serbians,
14
15 *Condemning* the acts of violence committed against United Nations peacekeeping
16 forces in the area,
17
18 *Alarmed by* the current state of safe zones in Bosnia,
19
20 *Emphasizing* the need for support from the United Nations in order to achieve
21 peace and stability in Bosnia,
22
23 1. *Calls upon* the aggressors within the State of Bosnia to cease acts of violence
24 against civilians and United Nations Protection Force personnel;
25
26 2. *Demands* that the established United Nations safe zones be respected and no
27 further molestation occur to the occupants within them;
28
29 3. *Authorizes accordingly* the deployment of the following United Nations
30 Protection Forces based on the recommendation of the Secretary-General:
31 (a) 30,000 United Nations Protection Force personnel, 5000 of which will be

33 deployed in Sarajewo and 2,500 of which will be deployed in Srebrenica for the
34 purposes of peacekeeping;
35 (b) The remaining amount of troops will be deployed at the discretion of the
36 United Nations Protection Force , following the equipping of the declared safe
37 zones with the appropriate amount of United Nations Protection Force personnel;

39 4. *Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.*
