- All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for their choice of country assignment.
- · After each participating school has been assigned one delegation in the first round, those schools that registered for more than one delegation will receive an additional assignment in a subsequent round, until all registration requests have been fulfilled.
- Lottery application is due on Sunday, 19 November before 5:00 p.m. in the Ohio Room.
- A non-refundable \$120 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2024 fees.

Safety at AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests.
