





**Dr. Brian Endless** is the Director of African Studies and the African Diaspora at Loyola University Chicago, where he also serves as a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Political Science. He serves as the President of the Board of American Model United Nations International. He is also the President of the Come Together Project, dedicated to solving the problems facing our society by bringing people together to get past the culture wars and find real solutions. On the international side he is also President of the Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation (HRRF),working on post-conflict truth, reconciliation and peace inthe aftermath of genocide in the Rwanda region.

# Safety at AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, and encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel. We also suggest that you follow several commonsense rules to keep all participants safe during the Conference. These include the following:

- As a general rule, do not leave the hotel grounds without letting your group know how to find you.

- Help other participants to be safe by encouraging others to not travel outside of the hotel alone.
- Inform one of the leaders of your group immediately if you have a safety concern, or if any emergency situation occurs to you or another participant, regardless of the time.
- Remember that safety should always be more important than avoiding minor embarrassment to you or another person.
