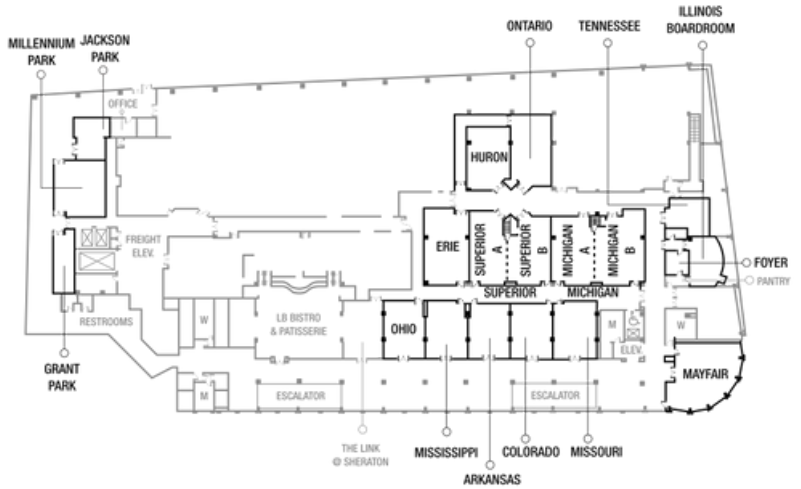

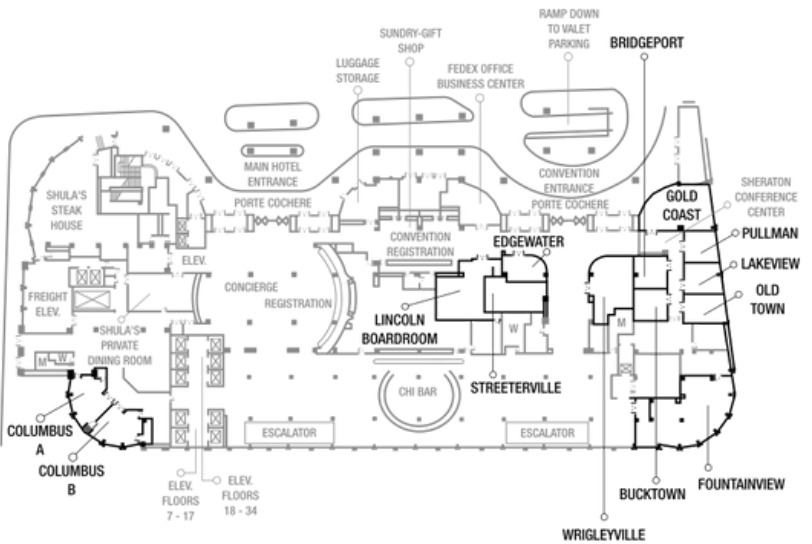

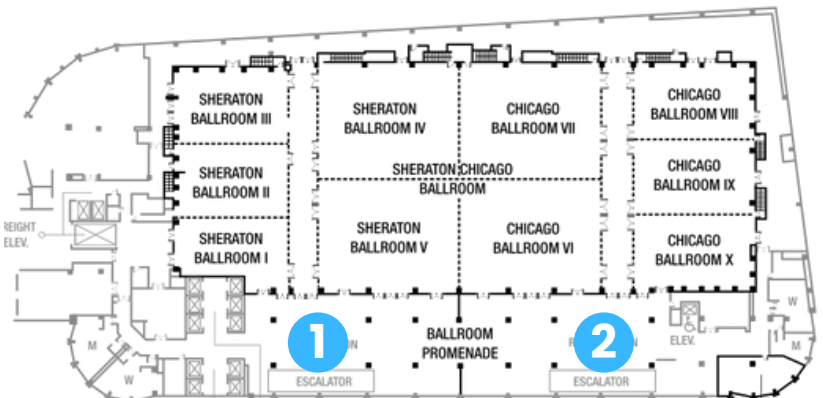

Safety at AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, and encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel. We also suggest that you follow several commonsense rules to keep all participants safe during the Conference. These include the following:

- As a general rule, do not leave the hotel grounds without letting your group know how to find you.
- Always let one of the leaders of your group (faculty, club officer, etc.) know where you are going prior to leaving the area around the hotel (to visit local friends or relatives, etc.).
- Never leave the hotel alone after dark.
- Always travel with at least one person that you know.
- Always remove your name tag prior to leaving the hotel so as not to advertise yourself as a tourist.
- Help other participants to be safe by encouraging others to not travel outside of the hotel alone.
- Inform one of the leaders of your group immediately if you have a safety concern, or if any emergency situation occurs to you or another participant, regardless of the time.
- Remember that safety should always be more important than avoiding minor embarrassment to you or another person.
