SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Empowering people and ensuring inclusiveness and

equality

SUBMITTED TO: The Economic and Social Council

The Economic and Social Council,

Guided by the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Addis Ababa Action Agenda of the Third International Conference on Financing for Development and the Paris Agreement (2015),

Recognizing the increasing global disparities exacerbated by climate change, including limited access to technology, healthcare and education,,

Acknowledging the importance of highlighting minority voices on policy development on the issue of climate change,,

Further acknowledging the disproportionality in climate change effects, which primarily harms the global south and the developing Member States,

Deeply concerned with those who are affected by disasters caused by climate change,

Desiring the development and implementation of national adaptation plans supported by the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC),

Further recognizing the urgent need to address climate change and the importance of inclusive development that ensures access to social service, opportunities and equal rights for all individuals while promoting environmental sustainability and resilience to the climate impact,

Emphasizing the importance of international cooperation and solidarity in promoting sustainable development and climate resilience,

Highlighting the negative effects of climate change on less developed Member States that are heavily dependent on the agricultural sector,

Bearing in mind the commitments of the Paris Agreement (2015) under the UNFCCC,

Further recognizing the importance of empowering communities and reinforcing commitments to Sustainable Development Goals 10, 15 and 16, especially when reducing inequality and promoting sustainable development,

- 1. Recommends the UNFCCC to create a sub-committee entitled the "Regional Support Forums for Climate Resilience" (RSFCR), which is intended to provide a forum for less developed Member States experiencing severe climate impacts to freely discuss their concerns and potential solutions within the following framework and conditions:
- (a) It operates as subsidiaries of the Economic and Social Council, meeting twice annually during the council's session and permitting additional ad-hoc meetings in response to urgent climate crises;
- (b) Membership includes representatives from affected countries, regional experts and stakeholders from private and public sectors, ensuring equitable participation by women, youth and indigenous peoples;
- 2. Calls upon all Member States to integrate climate mitigation and adaptation measures into national policies with a focus on the most vulnerable and marginalized communities;

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- 3. Affirms that the UNFCCC, as needed, may also create local committees that confront specific concerns that affect fixed areas and groups delegated on an individual basis, thus recommending that Member States in these local forums of the UNFCCC reflect the concerns of the people it represents, paying particular attention to the concerns of women, youth and indigenous peoples;
- 4. Further encourages the establishment of funding and support for the transition to net-zero emissions, climate-resilient economies and prioritizing investment in sustainable infrastructure, renewable energy and low carbon technology;
- 5. *Urges* Member States to provide support to those affected by climate-related disasters such as floods, droughts and inclement weather by:
- (a) Providing food, medical aid, knowledge sharing, debt release and financial support for countries who have experienced climate-related disasters;
- (b) Supporting the United Nations Central Emergency to help fund responses to rising disasters;
- (c) Encouraging the United Nations Environment Programme to continue to address climate-related issues by helping them adapt and reduce emissions in order to reduce the number of individuals who are negatively impacted by climate change;
- 6. Requests all Member States make an effort to assist poorer communities that are dependent on agricultural practices to develop sustainable, climate-smart farming practices through government and community initiatives;
- 7. Calls upon Member States to ensure that policy implementations will be in the best interest of those most in need;
- 8. Further calls upon all Member States to send developmental aid to countries directly affected by climate change;
  - Urges Member States to incorporate biodiversity protections into policy objectives that support local economies, advance sustainable agriculture and improve food security, particularly in rural areas;
  - 10. Calls upon all Member States to incorporate climate resilience strategies into national development plans as well as guarantee that climate adaptation and mitigation measures are inclusive and equitable;
  - 11. Requests the Secretary-General to report annually on the progress and outcomes of the Climate Resilience through Regional Cooperation to the Economic and Social Council.
