SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Rights of indigenous peoples

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Third Committee

The General Assembly Third Committee,

Noting the rights of indigenous peoples laid out by the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP),

Highlighting United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 10, reducing inequalities, and the importance of doing so for all Member States and all peoples, including indigenous peoples,

5 Deeply concerned about the dangers of living within conflict zones and the lack of resources 6 necessary for life available to those affected by conflict,

Emphasizing the dangers of displacement due to conflict and the long history of the displacement of indigenous peoples and communities due to discriminatory policies or armed conflict,

Noting the intersection of indigenous peoples and conflict, recognizing that indigenous peo ples are often innocent bystanders dismayed by conflicts between Member States, and acknowledg ing their disproportionate vulnerability to the impacts of war, land disputes, resource extraction and
 political marginalization,

Recognizing the danger that conflict zones pose to heritage sites of cultural and religious significance,

Noting with appreciation General Assembly resolution 73/328 of 25 July 2019 on promoting interreligious and intercultural dialogue and tolerance in countering hate speech, and General Assembly resolution 75/309 of 21 July 2021, which proclaimed 18 June as the International Day for Countering Hate Speech, to be observed annually,

Call for Member States that violate the designation of these zones and destroy cultural heritage sites to be read to the International Court of Justice which will work to settle disputes,

Inspired by the #UniteforHeritage campaign launched on 15 March 2015 with its goal to protect and safeguard heritage in areas where it is threatened by extremists,

23 Deeply disturbed by the widespread persistence of conflicts which force the displacement of 24 indigenous people,

1. Urges Member States to discuss conflicts between Member States with indigenous peoples,
 representatives and their governments:

(a) Calls upon Member States and UNESCO to discuss the rights that indigenous peoples
 hold during conflict and war;

- (b) Implores Member States to recognize indigenous peoples have the right to under stand the history of the conflict;
- 31 (c) Encourages Member States to meet with indigenous peoples in order to hear their 32 opinions on wartime procession;

(d) Requests that Member States give indigenous governments and peoples a voice in
 ongoing conflicts and the outcomes of said conflicts;

2. *Calls upon* the UNESCO World Heritage Committee that works toward the protection of cultural heritage during and after crises to:

- (a) Continue to designate cultural heritage sites as demilitarized zones to protect cul tural heritage, religious identity and economic prosperity, highlighting those of indigenous importance;
- (b) Asks that indigenous peoples submit cultural heritage sites to the UNESCO World
 Heritage Committee to be considered to become a heritage site;
- 41 (c) Call for Member States that violate the designation of these zones and destroy cul-42 tural heritage sites to be read to the International Court of Justice which will work to settle disputes;
- 43 3. Strongly encourages that Member States collaborate with indigenous peoples during wartime 44 and conflict in order to stop displacement due to violence or persecution.
