SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Situation in the Congo

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1961

The Historical Security Council - 1961,

Reaffirming the authorization of the United Nations Operation in the Congo (ONUC) by the late Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjld,

Bearing in mind the potential impact of the death of former Congolese Prime Minister Patrice Lumumba,

Emphasizing the importance of communication and dialogue between all those involved in this conflict,

Reaffirming the Belgian sentiment to pull out all of its forces and citizens from the region,

Reminding all member-states of their responsibilities under the General Assembly resolution 1474 (1960) of 16 September 1960 and Security Council resolutions 143 (1960) of 14 July 1960, 145 (1960) of 22 July 1960 and 146 (1960) of 22 July 1960,

Being alarmed by the development of concerning events regarding the safety and lives of UN peacekeepers, demonstrating the lack of ability for ONUC peacekeeping forces to carry out the missions outlined in the ONUC mandate,

Condemning all indiscriminate and retaliatory killings of any innocent civilians,

- 1. Requires the expulsion of all foreign military, paramilitary forces, mercenaries and political advisors not under the United Nations Command from the Republic of the Congo, including the province of Katanga;
- 2. Orders the release of any and all evidence, including audio logs, flight logs and any other relevant information found in the investigation into the death of former Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold;
- 3. Calls for the immediate creation of a series of peace summits with the presence of all representation from all factional leaders in the Republic of the Congo, including but not limited to Moise Tshombe in the Province of Katanga, Antoine Gezinga in Stanleyville and Joseph Kasa-Vubu of the Republic of the Congo;
- 4. Calls for the oversight of the enforcement of SC Resolution 143 (1960) of 14 July 1960 by the Multilateral Oversight Committee established in HSC-RES-1:
- (a) *Enforces* the removal of all Belgian forces from the Republic of the Congo, including the Katanga region;
- (b) *Recommends* the investigation of Belgian Officers involved in the training of Secession forces in Katanga by the Multilateral Oversight Committee;
- (c) Advises that all member states should take necessary actions to apply pressure to Belgium and all Belgium mining companies present in the Congo, should it continue to ignore SC Resolution 143 (1960) of 14 July 1960;
- 5. *Urges* a minimum increase of an additional 15,000 ONUC peacekeeping troops within the next month from the passing of this Resolution;
 - 6. Further defines the mandate of ONUC peacekeeping troops:;

- 7. *Permits* the use of force to subdue any present threat be used by ONUC peacekeeping forces in the below sub-subclauses:
 - (a) Reaffirms the use of force In the act of self-defense against armed groups not directly controlled by Member States, if the individual peacekeeper's life is threatened than lethal force shall be permitted;
 - (b) Allows use of force for the protection of unarmed combatants and civilians or in imminent danger of death or battery, only if there is a lethal threat to the subject of this sub-subclause shall lethal force be permitted;
 - (c) Endorses the use of force by ONUC forces to protect any humanitarian aid and refugee camps from hostile and armed seizure or interference, if the conditions for lethal force outlined in the two above sub-sub clauses then lethal force shall be permitted;
 - (d) Defines reasonable cause as when peacekeeping forces have 'specific and articulable facts' that provide an 'objective basis' that one or more of the conditions outlined in clause 5, subclause a, sub-sub clause i-iii are met;
- 8. Calls for the protection of the border between the Republic of the Congo and The UN trusteeship Tanganyika for the safe transportation of refugees;
 - 9. Temporarily authorizes the ONUC forces to patrol, secure and provide humanitarian aid to specific towns where violent massacres are confirmed by the United Nations to have occurred after the passage of this resolution for the purpose of aid distribution and the protection of refugees;
 - 10. Sets the time frame of the ONUC mandate until one of the following conditions is met:
 - (a) A cease-fire of at least one year is maintained by all major parties involved;
 - (b) The end of the year of 1965;
- (c) The ONUC mandate is no longer approved of by the Government of the Republic of the Congo.
