SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Open Agenda

The Security Council,

1 *Recalling* the expanded mandate of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) un-
2 der Resolution 1701 (2006) to oversee ceasefires, monitor conflict along the Blue Line, and assist the
3 Lebanese government in securing its borders,

4 *Deeply disturbed* by the catastrophic increase in civilian casualties in Lebanon,

5 *Recognizing* the role of Lebanon as a uniquely consequential geopolitical locus in the Middle
6 East and the global imperative to maintain regional stability,

7 *Concerned* by the absence of an international response to instability and subpar security mea-
8 sures along the southern border of Lebanon,

9 *Reaffirming* the right to unrestricted access to humanitarian aid underscored in Resolutions
10 2735 (2024) and 2417 (2018),

11 *Expressing* grave concern regarding the recent attacks coordinated against a resource-depleted
12 UNIFIL,

13 *Acknowledging* the importance of respecting the sovereignty of each State and the existential
14 need to prevent conflict among States,

15 1. *Condemns* all violations of international law, deliberate obstructions of UN missions, and vio-
16 lence directed at UN entities;

17 2. *Demands* an immediate and unconditional ceasefire between all parties in Lebanon;

18 3. *Calls upon* the Israeli Defense Force to withdraw all troops from established buffer zones in
19 Lebanon;

20 4. *Calls for* the immediate increase of funding to UNIFIL for non-lethal monitoring mechanisms
21 along the Blue Line including human and technological border monitors such as migration monitors,
22 radar systems and automated border crossing systems;

23 5. *Requests* that UNIFIL facilitate a joint security initiative along the Blue Line featuring:

24 (a) A multilateral data-sharing agreement extended to relevant stakeholders and re-
25 gional powers including Israel, Lebanon and Egypt encompassing;

26 (i) A stated goal of exchanging border security intelligence as a mechanism to promote
27 peace dialogue;

28 (ii) A transparency clause that equally delegates data access among the appropriate
29 governing bodies of each signatory;

30 (iii) The creation of a public security database mirroring the structure of databases
31 managed by INTERPOL and United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT);

32 (b) A UNIFIL oversight process to ensure the effectiveness of the joint security initiative
33 and release reports on the status of its implementation;

34 6. *Urges* able States to increase humanitarian aid, specifically food and medical supplies, di-
35 rected to affected civilian populations in Jordan, Lebanon and regional States affected by the spillover
36 effects of conflict in Lebanon and Israel;

37 7. *Requests* dialogue between Israel and Lebanon to expand internationally recognized buffer
38 zones along the Blue Line to enable the flow of humanitarian aid and unimpeded freedom of move-
39 ment;

40 8. *Endorses* the formation of regional peace agreements with membership extended to third-
41 party States;

42 9. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
